(meaning *Little Frenchie* or simply *Frenchie* in Portuguese) is a Portuguese sandwich originally from Porto, made with bread, wet-cured ham, linguiça, fresh sausage like chipolata, steak or roast meat and covered with melted cheese and a hot thick tomato and beer sauce served with french fries.

It is a very popular dish in Porto made with pork.

Saint Catherine. To create this magnificent piece of work 16.000 tiles were needed.

São Bento Railway Station



Inaugurated in 1916, the historical station is known for its tile panels that depict scenes of the History of Portugal. The most remarkable panels are those showing King João I and Queen Philippa of Lancaster by the city's cathedral in 1387, Prince Henry the Navigator conquering Ceuta in Morocco, and a representation of the Battle of Arcos de Valdevez.

Clérigos



Between 1732 and 1763, Italian architect Nicolau Nasoni designed a baroque church with a tower that became its architectural and visual icon: the Torre dos Clérigos (English: Clerics Tower).

Lello & Irmão Bookstore



Lonely Planet considered Lello & Irmão Bookstore as the third most beautiful library in the world. The store has an excellent neo-

gothic façade. This facade is only surpassed by its stunning interior, designed by Xavier Esteves.

The building was inaugurated on January 13th, in 1906.
